Message from THE Founders

How quickly another year flies by. This time last year, as we penned our summary letter to you, we concluded with concern for the year that lay ahead - a year we knew would be one of our most difficult on record. At that time (April 2020) COVID-19 was just starting to make its devastating global impact. Today, the news is filled with second waves, with countries like India and Nepal being devastated. We all live in hope.

2020 came and went. And although it was indeed a challenging year (for everyone), Captivating, our projects, partners, and most of our beneficiaries live to fight another day. There were indeed casualties where small businesses were lost due to lockdowns, and students out of school due to closures, with many of these issues still continuing in Nepal and the Philippines. But, what also resulted was consolidation, determination to get through this, and an overall spirit of survival coming through. This was amazing to be a part of.

So, how did we go? You'll read in this annual update of a global donor base that is simply outstanding. In a year where we braced for a financial fallout, we finished slightly up on 2019. This was an unbelievable result, especially considering many of our fundraising events had to be canceled due to COVID restrictions. You will read of projects in China continuing largely unaffected, while activities in the Philippines and Nepal had to change direction - moving more towards creative solutions, emergency relief, and care packages.

In the end, still, over 10,000 lives were directly impacted through amazing on-the-ground efforts. Through this time, over 30 Captivating funded partner staff tested positive for COVID. Thankfully everyone survived. At the time of writing, Nepal is being hit hard by a second wave and so we hold our breath for the safety of our teams and those they are helping.

We brace for another difficult year but are thankful we are on the ground where it matters to make the best impact we can. Our theme for 2021 is something we feel very strongly about: "TOGETHER we are ONE". We exist to put our differences aside, and simply help the most underprivileged we can find. Help them reach out for a better tomorrow. We can't do it without you, our generous supporters, and donors.

Thanks for helping us survive 2020. Let's thrive in 2021. TOGETHER as one.






Although decreased in dollar terms, as a % of expenses it is up slightly due to program funds dropping significantly for the year.

aptivating fully funded six monitoring stations in Nepal during 2020. During this time, trained staff with government approval, stopped 2,897 suspicious looking cases, and did not allow them to continue with their travel plans. 511 girls were referred to the police because substantial, hard evidence was found to confirm that trafficking was involved.

Most who are trafficked will never be seen again. We believe that this may have prevented many of them from a life of exploitation, torture and abuse. These small, but effective, checkpoints are set up near important transit hubs and border crossings.

RESCUE & RAIDS

48 girls and women were rescued from brothels and pimps in Nepal and India during 2020. Carefully planned in close coordination with local police and government officials, these dangerous rescues are returning girls to safety and freedom. Medical help, counselling and legal aid is provided for these victims of human trafficking and abuse. Often a court case is filed against the perpetrator and more often than not, results in prison sentences for traffickers.

aptivating is supporting the engagement of whole communities, in both villages and schools, in the battle against Human Trafficking. Through our on the ground partners, we are creating a ripple effect that is impacting hundreds and saving lives. 350 people were given the opportunity to learn about the dangers of human trafficking in 2020 and how to keep themselves and their children safe and where to go if they need help.



MY BUSINESS MY FREEDOM

MICROFINANCE PROGRAM 519 women were part of the My Business My Freedom program during 2020. This microfinance program helps vulnerable women into their own small business which provides financial freedom to her and her children. Covid-19 lockdowns created struggles for most of these women, however with support from the team and each other, businesses are opening again and these women are feeling confident about their future.

he genuine opportunities for women in the My Business My Freedom program to generate their own income, means that she will be less likely to slip into high-risk situations such as prostitution, or travelling to unsafe places for work.

COMMUNITY RADIO BROADCASTING

Since 2013, 3 Angels Community Radio (3ACR) has been broadcasting throughout Nepal. Over the years, this has proven to be an effective means of communicating about the dangers of human trafficking and growing awareness in remote communities. During 2020, Captivating was the majority funder of the operating costs of the station which successfully reached 72 districts of Nepal from its broadcasting base in Pokhara and through multiple relay station partnerships reaching an estimated 21,000,000 Nepali people.

3ACR is reaching families who are in vulnerable situations by broadcasting 17 hours, 7 days a week covering a wide range of relevant topics such as health and hygiene programs, agricultural help, legal aid and children's programs. In particular during 2020, the radio station was a voice of hope during the Covid-19 pandemic by providing updates and health warnings and clear preventative measures. They were instrumental in supplying emergency care packages to many who called in on the hotline during COVID-19 lockdowns.

Ustice is not fully served until perpetrators of abuse are arrested and dealt with according to the law. Achieving a sense of justice also helps survivors of abuse in their healing and recovery. We want to prevent these traffickers from victimizing more women and children.

19 court cases were filed in the court system during 2020. This was done with the assistance of local police. More often than not, the outcomes of these cases result in prison sentences.

540 women received legal assistance for abuse and mistreatment as well as their rights on various other legal matters.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE & LEGAL HELP



WOMEN'S SAFE HAVEN

he primary scope and purpose of the Safe Haven is to provide shelter, support and ongoing personal empowerment and control to victims of trafficking. However, the program has also progressively (and quite organically) widened its scope to provide support to severe cases of gender-based violence until their safety and right to live a dignified life is stabilized. Victims of rape (especially minors) are also referred to the Safe Haven by police and hospitals.

32 women transitioned through the Safe Haven during 2020. During their stay, they received medical help, counselling, and training in a particular skill that will provide them with employable skills and independence.




VOCATIONAL SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

he Vocational School Scholarship Program is a 3-year vocational schooling program where girls, mostly from agricultural and pastoral areas in Western China region, are helped to get back to school to complete their education.

A total of 277 girls are studying in a field of their choice, growing in confidence and independence. A dream most thought would never come true.

MY FIRST JOB

There was both excitement and apprehensiveness in the air as 120 women joined the My First Job Assistant Chef Program across four regions in July 2020. Most had missed the majority of their schooling but the teacher took the time needed to explain measurements, different types of food and different cooking styles.

New confidence was building in these women and after a few short months of training, as well as internships, 113 women graduated as assistant chefs. Many of these women graduated with job offers from their internships. We are confident that most of these women will have jobs in the near future.

HUSKY ENERGY* TAILORING SKILLS PROGRAM FOR WOMEN

n July 2020, 30 women started the Husky Energy* Tailoring Skills Program for Women. After 3 months of intensive training, the women were able to make beautiful Tibetan and Mongolian robes and 27 women successfully graduated and commenced their internships. Most of these women are from remote areas in Western China and have little to no education so this is a huge accomplishment for them.

This program has taught them skills that they have taken with them into employment. All the 27 graduating women are now in jobs where they are able to earn a stable income and increase their family's financial status. They are proudly working hard to provide a bright future for their children.

117 families benefitted from the Pig for Prosperity Project during 2020. These underprivileged families each received two pigs to raise and breed piglets to sell. Each family was excited to receive their pigs and go through the training from professionals on how to best raise pigs, when to breed, when to sell and how to keep them healthy.

Each sow usually produces two litters of nine piglets each year. This extra income from these small, homebased businesses, significantly makes a difference financially to be able to continue sending their children to school and to be able to provide living and food security for their large families.

STOP CYBERSEX CRIME he Philippines is number 1 in the world for cybersex crime. Driven by poverty and desperation, supported by wealthy western countries, this heinous crime targets the vulnerable and innocence is taken.

1,559 school students and women from high risk areas, participated in cybersex awareness programs run by our partner Honor 1000. This program sheds light on this issue, explains the dangers and also shares how and where to get help.

Although COVID-19 lockdowns, school closures and community gatherings have been banned since March 2020, we have still seen a significant impact in this space by the team going into the community and reaching families where they are by going door-to-door, social media advertising, and handing out resources and information brochures.





he Blessed House is recognised by the government and NGOs (International Justice Mission and Voice of the Free) as a safe place of referral for children rescued through raids on cybersex crime. It is also a place of referral for women who are survivors of human trafficking.

During 2020, 12 minors and 3 women, rescued from human trafficking, found shelter in The Blessed House. 9 rescued victims of online sexual exploitation, aged between two months and 28 years old (28-year-old woman is deaf and mute) were referred and received counseling and much needed support. These survivors stay at the safe house for about 3 months until a new and safe foster home can be found for them to live. 6 women and 6 children were reintegrated back into their community after rehabilitation and skill building.

MICROFINANCE PROGRAM

urrent estimated population of children in the Philippines is at 31% (33 million)¹, and studies show an alarmingly large percentage of these children - 8 out of 10 - are vulnerable to trafficking and online sexual abuse and exploitation. This is fueled by widespread poverty, lack of jobs, and easy access to the internet. With the close-knit nature of Filipino families, it has been a cultural norm for them to do whatever it takes to help the family survive². Unfortunately for some, this could mean endangering the lives of their very own children and doing what it takes to survive.

Microfinance helps by providing families the opportunity to take out small loans to either start or grow their small business. 2,365 families are part of the Honor 1000 Microfinance Project and are working hard to provide for their children, significantly reducing the risk of these families falling into the trap of cybersex crime or human trafficking.

COVID-19 significantly impacted the women and their businesses due to constant lock-downs. This was a very difficult time for all those involved in this program. We are happy to report that starting in August, the majority of businesses recommenced.
