On behalf of **Captivating International** please accept our thanks for the continuous support you have provided over the past year. Your continued support allows us to reach new heights and achieve our goals as we work hard to continue empowering women, educating children, and elevating communities!

We know the past year has been turbulent for the global economy and **Captivating International** is proud to report we have had a very stable year. Revenue remained the same as the previous year, and all 2023 projects were implemented as planned except for our microfinance programs in Nepal and the Philippines. Both fell short of expansion targets due to what became a year of consolidation for both programs. This was mostly due to the writing down of outstanding loans that were unable to be revived post-COVID. So, this has been a tough year for these businesses. The good news is that both programs are now repositioned for growth and expansion moving forward.

Even though we are a charity small in size, we do pride ourselves on the significant impact achieved through our amazing on-the-ground partners across three countries. In total, we calculate over 10,000 lives were directly and positively impacted during 2023. A further 50,000 were reached through their attendance at Captivating funded education & awareness campaigns and, new for 2023, remote village medical camps.

Every year as an organization we motivate ourselves with a theme for the year's work. This year our theme is **"Standing with You"**. Our China team will be hosting its 16th Annual Captivating Charity Gala and will task the Shenzhen community to stand with us for another year of fundraising. All our global teams, and on-the-ground partners, will continue to give support to those in need in China, Nepal, and the Philippines. We will stand by them as we execute our life-changing projects and provide them the resources they need to prosper and implement the solutions we have in place to lessen the income inequality our world faces.

### **TOTAL REVENUE** ►►

Given that the global economy slowed down, and costs of living increased, it was a very pleasing result that donations continued to be received with our revenue being similar to the previous year. This revenue includes all related entities/partners. We are extremely thankful to our generous donors and partners continuing to support Captivating.

## **FUNDS DIRECT TO PROGRAMS** ▲4%

Program support increased in 2023 (up USD 81,000) due to the implemenation of additional projects and programs. It is expected 2024 program rollouts will remain consistent and in line with expectations.

## **PROJECT SUPPORT COSTS ▼3%**

Overall, a decrease is Captivating support costs across the board due to staff and allocation changes.

## **CORPORATE SERVICES ▼1%**

Total actual costs of corporate services remained the same, but as a % decreased slightly when expressed as a % of total expenses due to higher funds direct to projects.

### SURPLUS FOR THE YEAR

On a global Captivating basis, there was a surplus of USD 117,000 due to a reduction in project support costs and funding being fully in 2023 for expansion programs which have been delayed in their implementation (microfinance mostly). Captivating continues to be in a strong position for program expansion in 2024.



# INTERCEPTING

STOP a girl before she is trafficked — this has been our mantra when it comes to human trafficking. With the rising cases of human trafficking in Nepal every year, our monitoring stations in the country serve as the last line of defense to intercepting girls who are at high risk of being trafficked before they cross the Nepal border.

With our dedicated on-the-ground team, 3 Angels Nepal, six policesupported monitoring stations operate in areas considered trafficking and transit hot-spots. Captivating fully funds the operation of these stations, where staff are instructed to stop any suspicious-looking cases to interview girls and their escorts to ensure legitimacy.

Intercepted girls are then given counseling and reunited with their family or relatives. This is important work and we are glad to have intercepted 5,400 women and girls from going to their destination, and referred 153 girls to the police for further investigation.







# Vescand RAIDS

As per the 2022 National Human Rights Report (*published on January 4, 2023*), "around 40,300 Nepalis, most of them women and girls, were trafficked over the past two years, while around 1.9 million people are at risk for trafficking. Those trafficked from Nepal are mostly taken to India, trafficking being abetted by open borders and cultural similarities. Around 50 women are taken to the southern neighbor every single day, which also happens to be a transit point for trafficking to many other countries." Harsh laws, stiff penalties.

In 2023, our partner, 3 Angels Nepal, were involved in the rescue and reintegration of 96 girls aleady trapped in situations of forced labor and/or sexual exploitation Our team in Nepal is dedicated to rescuing girls from these nightmares by carefully planning and constantly coordinating with the local authorities. This endeavor is not just about raids or rescues. It goes beyond just snatching the girl from the danger she finds herself in; we also guide and help her reclaim her life through medical, legal, and emotional support provided by our team.

# women's fe haven

Women's Safe Haven continues to be a place of refuge and support for the girls who were intercepted and rescued from human trafficking. Some of these girls were already abandoned by their families and have no one to turn to. The Safe Haven serves as a new home for them, providing them with counseling, medical aid, and physical and emotional support to help them get back on their feet.

Part of the rehabilitation program is the skill building which aims to secure them with alternative sources of livelihood or employment on their road to recovery and independence.

In 2023, 48 women and girls found a home in Women's Safe Haven; 33 of these young women participated in skills-based training related to the use of computers, tailoring, and beauty parlor work.






Nepal has one of the highest rates of child marriages globally. Despite the legal marriage age being 20, girls as young as 14 are married in remote areas of Nepal, depriving them of education and subjecting them to early motherhood, which poses significant health risks. These girls often lack autonomy and decision-making power.

With the thrust and vision of the Captivating Village Program, we now have 770 girls from 21 villages who are back in school. By giving them a chance to go back to school, we also give them a sense of freedom and choice for their future.

For the past year, we have seen the ripple effect this has been creating on our Captivating Village Program girls' families and their communities. As we open their eyes to see the importance of education to every child, we are also changing the culture and norms of these villages to see the value of women in society.

# MY BUSINESS Peedom MICROFINANCE PROGRAM

One of the root causes of human trafficking is extreme poverty. In Nepal, there are caste distinctions, which make it difficult for the lowest of castes to go to school, finish their education, and have access to employment. This sad reality makes it easy to lure Nepali women into human trafficking — by promising them a better life given their circumstances and background.

The My Business My Freedom Microfinance Program seeks to help these women from getting out of poverty by providing them with microloans to start their businesses. The team also gives them mentoring and plugs them into groups where they can empower and equip one another with business skills and a supportive network. Although MBMF is open to support any woman assessed as living in poverty, the primary focus is to assist women at risk of being trafficked, or moms with children who might be at risk

For the year 2023, we have seen 612 women as active members of the MBMF Program. This program allows them to find a sustainable source of livelihood for their family and thrusts them to a life safe from human trafficking and towards financial freedom and independence.





Our team in Nepal eagerly organizes the Hamro Abhiyan Program at local schools to raise awareness in hard-to-reach provinces in Nepal which are considered high-risk for human trafficking. This is one of the prevention strategies that we are doing to stop human trafficking in the country.

This interactive program has received good feedback from the students, leaders, and principals because it encourages open discussion on an otherwise taboo topic in schools. This program has already been very effective in increasing awareness among the students and providing valuable information to keep the students from the dangers of human trafficking and cybersex crimes.

So far the program has reached 5,130 school students and community members, as well as 491 uniformed personnel from the army and police force.



# CAPTIVATING VILLAGE DEVELOPMENTINITIATIVES

Our work in partnership with registered charity Captivating Nepal has been the progressive implementation throughout 2023 of a wholistic village development program. With primary focus on three areas: Health, Education and Livelihood Advancement, the team at Captivating Nepal focuses their work towards villages and communities failing to thrive. What drives our programs is knowing that within these communities are girls (and boys) at risk of becoming tomorrow's victims of trafficking, forced labor, and targeted victimization unless things become more stable for them at the home village.

2023 saw us launch our first village development program in a remote community at the Himalayan foothills. The target group is a total population of 800 families across wards (districts). Partnerships have been formalized with municipal and local level officials; planning sessions started with the principals and key staff of the 10 schools operating across this region; and livelihood programs have commenced directly focused on 150 women considered to be from the most marginalized of families from the total population.





By the close of 2023:

- Two health camps were run in partnership with the Kathmandu-based Scheer Memorial Hospital (providing comprehensive medical examinations to 898 women and 1,530 children).
- All 10 schools received comprehensive teaching resources as stage 1 of starting to address the quality (and interest) of education for village children.
- Strategies are being established to address the 21% of high-school drop-outs from the last year alone (75% being girls 100 girls in total).
- The first women's group was formally registered comprising of 75 women from marginalized households. This group will receive regular sessions on how to progressively advance their current situation and poverty.
- The first livelihood program was implemented, with 20 women receiving professional training, assistance, and start-up capital to start their own chicken business.

We are excited for this first village development program and our local partner looks forward to continually refining this model over its three to 4-year project timeline.

# ONE MORE YEAR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM



The One More Year Scholarship Program helps keep deserving young women in senior high school who would otherwise risk not graduating without support. More than the scholarship, the program opens up a life-changing opportunity for them to break away from the cycle of poverty by exponentially increasing their abilities and chances to get to higher or vocational education, secure meaningful work, and ultimately create a brighter future for themselves and their families.

As these girls secure another year in school, their financially struggling families are able to breathe a sigh of relief, no longer worrying about sacrificing necessities to send their kids to school. Likewise, the students are able to focus on their studies without feelings of guilt about being a "financial burden" on their families.

Through partnerships with high schools and vocational schools, coupled with teacher recommendations, we were able to find 600 students from the poorest-of-the-poor families and supported them through their studies.

Our aim to see these girls go as far as they can without quitting, and your generosity has enabled us to continue making this possible.

SUPPORT A VOLUNTEEReacher PROGRAM

We believe that every child, regardless of their economic situation, deserves access to quality education. Volunteer teachers play a crucial role in ensuring that children from rural and underserved communities are reached.

Despite the remoteness of location and harsh weather conditions, 30 volunteer teachers braved the challenge to bring their diverse experiences, skills, and knowledge to the classroom, as well as foster strong connections with students and parents in the communities they serve. As a result, we were able to create impact to 1,317 primary school students in 2023. These teachers are real life heroes.





# HUSKYenery TAILORING SKILLS PROGRAM FOR WOMEN

In remote and poor rural areas, many women struggle to balance caring for their families and supporting them financially. This struggle ultimately led to four women withdrawing early from the Husky Energy Tailoring Skills Program in 2023. Nonetheless, we are proud to announce that the remaining 26 single moms and young women completed the three-month training successfully!

Graduating from this program opens up more income-generating opportunities for the women, be it through securing employment in local sewing stores or starting their own small clothing business.

We are now in our sixth year of this program and we would like to thank Husky Energy (now a member of the Cenovus group of companies) for making this possible. Likewise, we are grateful for all the teachers who generously shared their expertise and tailoring their teaching methods to meet the varying needs of these amazing, but largely illiterate women..

# Chicken business POULTRY AND PROSPERITY PROGRAM

Home-based chicken-businesses for families living in remote locations is a worthwhile endeavor for them to improve their income flow. In 2023, we witnessed the successful completion of the Chicken Business Program where a total of 90 women were mentored through a full chicken raising cycle over a total period of eight months.

At the start of the program, each family received 20 chicks. The program wasn't all smooth-sailing with some families losing over 50% of their chicks due to various environmental and breeding factors, but the team worked tirelessly to support and uplift the families involved. Through constant communication, supplementary professional training, and the provision of additional chicks, we were able to achieve a 70% success rate for all 90 families in the program. Each family was able to sell up to 17 chickens resulting in a revenue between 2,000 and 4,000 RMB (277 to 533 USD). This makes a huge difference to a struggling family.

We learned a lot from this first cycle of the program and we are excited for all 90 women who expressed their intention to continue on with the business. The success of this first trial program has resulted in approval being given to proceed with another 90 women in a different remote location in 2024.

Our fight against Online Sexual Abuse and Exploitation of Children (OSAEC) is reaching more and more schools and institutions in the country. We have reached 28,838 individuals and trained 4,984 community advocates through awareness campaigns, cyber safety education programs, and infographic materials distribution in 2023.

The Department of Education, the Philippine National Police (PNP), and other non-government organizations have taken notice of our antitrafficking efforts and supported and joined us by rolling out their training to their key personnel and providing our team access to their organizations.

Seeing public and private offices raise their hands in support of our programs boosts our team's morale that we can put an end to these crimes. It's both hard work and teamwork that will make the Philippines a safer place to live in for women and children.

In 2023, 911 new women participated in the Microfinance Program in the Philippines. As we get to the bottom of human trafficking which is extreme poverty, we are continuously giving business opportunities to those women who are considered as high-risk. With a small capital to start their business, they now have the opportunity to provide for their families without resorting to cybersex crimes or human trafficking.

We are also strengthening our fellowship groups to provide accountability and support to our members and have started appointing coordinators for each area. Through these strategies, we are making the program more sustainable in the long run so we can empower more women in high-risk areas and see their businesses scale and expand in the coming years.









# MANIASLUM PROJECT

In 2023, we had 147 students from the slums who were successfully enrolled in schools. After a year of providing educational assistance, several students have been awarded and recognized for their academic achievements. Notably, one student even received a certificate for perfect attendance! We are proud and honored to support these hardworking students. For the past year, we have allowed these students to excel and strive in their education.

When it comes to education, we know that the parents play a very big role in ensuring that our beneficiaries continue in their studies. This is why our project also includes them. We are providing support to the moms of the beneficiaries through regular training and meetings. We have also plugged some of the moms into our microfinance program to help them financially. Through these dedicated efforts, the Manila Slum Project aspires to transform the lives of children and families in slum communities, offering them access to education and opportunities to build a brighter future.

The Manila Slum Program is a three-year program focused on sustainably resolving the out-of-school situation experienced by the majority of children across Manila's slum communities. For these 147 girls, this has certainly happened, but our focus for the remaining 1.5 years of this program is how to make that sustainable, not just for them, but for all children. To do this, our team is bringing together key stakeholders including the local government representatives, school principals and other local NGO groups to form a coalition of experts to police this program and put in place ongoing solutions focused on securing education so no-one misses out, and improving the livelihood of struggling families. Neighboring slum communities are seeing the difference happening with this pilot program, and are asking for this program to come to their neighbourhoods. Plans have now been approved to implement this solution into a second location starting July 2024.
